

Historically Black Colleges and Universities

Historically Black Colleges and Universities

- Before the Civil War, Cheney University and Lincoln University were established in Pennsylvania in 1837, and Wilberforce University in Ohio in 1856



Historically Black Colleges and Universities

- Most HBCUs were established after the American Civil War
- 99 HBCUs
- Located over the United States
- Most in the East USA
- Some in West and Midwest USA



Historically Black Colleges and Universities

Status

- In 2004, the U.S. Department of Education published a study of HBCUs which concluded that, as of 2001, HBCUs accounted for 13% of black higher education enrollment

Historically Black Colleges and Universities

- In 2007, the Thurgood Marshall College Fund published a study of minority recruiting practices by Fortune 400 companies and by government agencies that found that 13% of the college graduates were recruited from HBCUs and 87% were recruited from non-HBCU schools



Historically Black Colleges and Universities

- Today, HBCU institutions in America offer 27 doctoral programs and 52 provide graduate degree programs at the Master's level. At the undergraduate level, 83 HBCUs offer a Bachelor's degree program and 38 offer Associate degrees
